# TPOL Advising Notes

## Full-time vs. Part-time:

- Full-time students must be enrolled in a minimum of 9 credits (3 courses) per semester. Full-time TPOL students typically complete the program in one academic year.
- Part-time students typically enroll in two courses per semester and complete the TPOL program in two academic years.

## Suggested Course Sequence:

- All students should plan to take PUBP 715: Introduction to Transportation Systems during their first or second semester
  - Class is offered only in the fall.
- Elective courses should not be taken until a student has completed a minimum of 12 credits of required coursework.
- *Please note:* core courses are offered only during the fall and spring semesters. Elective courses are offered all year round.

## Study Abroad Opportunities:

- *Any* SPP-sponsored study abroad course may count as an elective.
- Unless prior written permission is obtained, students may apply only one study abroad course (3 credits) toward graduation. For more information on study abroad opportunities, please visit:

## Academic Requirements:

- Students must maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average to graduate.
- Students may apply up to six credits of "C" toward graduation.
- A student is automatically dismissed if he receives a grade of "F" in a single course and/or a grade of "C" in nine or more credits.
- Students must complete all TPOL requirements within *six years* of the date of initial enrollment as a degree-seeking student.
- SPP allows students to transfer up to four courses (where a grade of B or better has been earned) from non-degree to degree seeking status.
- No more than six graduate credit hours of work performed at another university prior to admission into the TPOL program may be transferred.
- Elective courses should not be taken until a student has completed a minimum of 11-12 credits of required coursework.
- Elective courses are offered year round (fall, spring and summer).
- All *non-SPP* courses have to be pre-approved by your academic advisor before registering.
- PhD level courses and/or foreign language courses are *not* permissible elective options.
